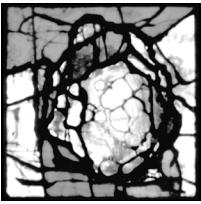

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity
May 27, 2018

Aaaaahhhh the Memorial Day Weekend. I love this National Holiday because it is ultimately a solemnity set aside to reflect on those who have given their lives securing the freedoms we enjoy. For these, we must properly 'take a knee' as it were, in consecration to self-evident truths for which men and women died. While our Country may be polarized, I remain convinced that she is a gift to the world. That this Country's most vocal critics are her greatest beneficiaries only solidifies my conviction (I think we can agree, for example, that George Clooney et al live quite well). Those claiming oppression from the red carpet of the Oscars also reinforce my Memorial Day zealotry. That said, Memorial Day foments gratitude for the bounty of those who have offered themselves. 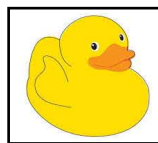

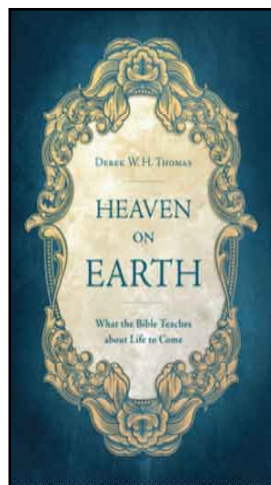

DID YOU KNOW?

Reflecting back on the 30th Anniversary of St Kateri Parish FR PAT'S STAINED GLASS WINDOW

Before his untimely death on September 3rd 2015, our beloved former Pastor Fr Pat Rice, both designed and paid for a Stained Glass Window that features drawings depicting his favorite Saints and others who serve as life role models. Manufactured and installed by Holy Land Art Co., LLC the window may be found in the left rear side of the Church. Pictured in the window, which will be dedicated by Bishop Serratelli on September 29th as part of our 30th Anniversary celebration you will find:

HELDER CAMARA – A Brazilian Archbishop of Olinda and Recife serving from 1964 to 1985 during the military regime of the country. He is remembered for his political work for Human Rights and democracy through non-violence.

MIRIAM TERESA – An American Ruthenian Sister of Charity. She was born in 1901 in Bayonne, NJ and died at the age of 26. She was beatified by the Church in 2014 the first such ceremony to take place in the United States.

R MICHAEL McGIVNEY – He was an American Catholic Priest based in New Haven, Ct. He founded the Knights of Columbus, the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization, to serve as a mutual aid and fraternal insurance organization.

ARCHBISHOP ROMERO – Archbishop of San Salvador was murdered in 1980 while celebrating Mass in the chapel of The Divine Providence cancer hospital where he lived. Pope Francis has announced that he will be beatified on May 23.

JEAN DONOVAN – She was a modern-day martyr, losing her life while caring for the poor in the midst of El Salvador's bloody civil war. An American lay missionary who was beaten, raped and murdered with three fellow missionaries in El Salvador on December 2, 1980. Thirty years later, her memory continues to inspire.

KATERI TEKAKWITHA – The Patroness of our Parish canonized as the first Native American Saint in 2012.

MATT TALBOT – Patron of men and women struggling with alcoholism.

ST. COLUMBAN - An Irish missionary notable for founding numerous monasteries in early medieval Europe from around 590 AD in present day France and Italy.

ST MARIE GUERIN – A Catholic convert, married to St. Louis Martin and mother of nine children, five of them girls who became nuns, the youngest of whom was St Therese of Lisieux. St Marie was canonized a Saint in 2015.

DOROTHY DAY - Was an American journalist, born in New York, a social activist, who became a key figure in the Catholic Worker Movement, a pacifist movement providing direct aid to the poor and homeless.
